Hello Everyone,

Some of you may be unaware of possible property tax exemptions that you may be eligible for benefits in Lee County. Let me summarize these for you here.

Basic Property Tax Exemptions

Eligible residential veterans with a VA certified service-connected disability of 10 percent or greater shall be entitled to a \$5,000 deduction on the assessment of their home for tax exemption purposes. The veteran must establish this exemption with the Lee County Tax Office by providing documentation of this disability. The unremarried surviving spouse of a disabled exservice member, who on the date of the disabled ex-service member's death had been married to the ex-service member for at least five years, is also entitled to this exemption. (FS 196.24)

Additional Property Tax Exemptions

Any real estate owned and used as a homestead by a veteran, who was honorably discharged and has been certified as having a service-connected, permanent, and total disability is exempt from taxation if the veteran is a permanent resident of Florida and has legal title to the property on Jan. 1st of the tax year for which the exemption is being claimed. (FS 196.081(1)) Any real estate owned and used as a homestead by the surviving spouse of an Armed Forces member who died from service-connected causes while on active duty is exempt from taxation if the member was a permanent resident of Florida on Jan. 1st of the year in which the member died. (FS 196.081(4)(a)) If, upon the death of the veteran, the spouse holds the legal or beneficial title to the homestead and permanently resides there, the exemption from taxation carries over to the benefit of the veteran's spouse until such time as he or she remarries, sells, or otherwise disposes of the property. If the spouse sells the property, an exemption not to exceed the amount granted from the most recent ad valorem tax roll may be transferred to the new residence as long as it is used as the primary residence and the spouse does not remarry. (FS 196.081(3)) Any partially disabled veteran who is age 65 or older, any portion of whose disability was combat-related, and who was honorably discharged, may be eligible for a discount from the amount of ad valorem tax on the homestead commensurate with the percentage of the veteran's permanent serviceconnected disability. Eligible veterans should apply for this benefit at the county property appraiser's office. (FS 196.082) This exemption carries over to surviving spouses effective Jan. 1st, 2021. Any real estate used and owned as a homestead by any quadriplegic is exempt from taxation. Veterans who are paraplegic, hemiplegic, or permanently and totally disabled who must use a wheelchair for mobility, or are legally blind, may be exempt from real estate taxation. Check with the Lee County property appraiser to determine if gross annual household income qualifies. The veteran must be a resident of Florida. (FS 196.101) Service members entitled to homestead exemption in this state, and who are unable to file in person by reason of such service, may file through next of kin or a duly authorized representative. (FS 196.071)

Finally, if you are a Veteran in crisis or concerned about one, connect with caring, qualified responders at the Veteran's Crisis Line for confidential help by calling 1-800-273-8255, or by texting 838255. Many of them are Veterans themselves. Get more resources at: www.VeteransCrisisLine.net












TED CLARK

Ted Clark joined the Navy reserve when still in High School. Upon graduation from High School, Ted transferred to the regular Navy for 4 years and served from 1960-1964 as a Gun Fire Control Technician (FTG) aboard the 6th Fleet Admiral's flagship USS Springfield CLG-7, a guided missile light cruiser in the Mediterranean. Springfield cruised continuously with the sixth fleet and joined other fleet units and those of other nations in national and multinational exercises. He later transferred to the USS Mitscher DL-2 to complete his enlistment. Ted was discharged from the Navy in August 1964 as Petty Officer 2nd class (E-5). He holds the Navy Good Conduct medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Navy & "E" ribbon, the Navy Sea Service ribbon, and is a Vietnam Era veteran.

After his discharge from the Navy, Ted worked in banking for 10 years rising to the rank of Assistant VP in the Consumer Lending Division of a major bank. However, due to a lifelong desire to teach, Ted returned to college and earned his AS and BS degrees in business using the GI Education bill. Ted then earned an MBA, with a concentration in marketing, from Long Island University and a Ph.D. in Strategic Management from the State University of New York (SUNY) at Albany. Ted Clark retired from college teaching as a marketing professor, in the School of Business at the State University of New York in New Paltz. He taught for 30 years and was able to use his military service as "previous service" and retire early.



TED CLARK

During his tenure at SUNY, Professor Clark launched his own consulting company specializing in market research studies. A published author with interests in the areas of marketing, Ted received multiple awards and designations during his career. These include the Distinguished Teacher of the Year Award by the Alumni Association of SUNY New Paltz. The only business professor to receive this award twice and induction into the SUNY New Paltz School of Business Hall of Fame, one of only two faculty to receive that award. He was also the founder and advisor of the American Marketing Association (AMA)–New Paltz Chapter. Under his guidance, the New Paltz Chapter was the recipient of the International AMA's Superior or Outstanding Honor Awards for twelve (12) consecutive years and one of the top ten international chapters for 5 years, the smallest college to achieve that distinction and the only SUNY college. In addition, Ted was the recipient of the AMA's Outstanding Advisor Award and Advisor of the Year. Ted also received the Provost Award for Excellence in Faculty Service and is the former Director of the Business School's Business Institute. The Business Institute links the expertise of students and faculty with local and regional organizations to help solve business problems.

He retired in 2015 from Academia and moved to Cape Coral with his lovely wife, Carolyn but continues to consult in New York. His wife Carolyn is an RN and holds a BS and MS degree in Nursing and Nursing Administration and was a hospital administrator at a 300-bed hospital in New York.

In 2020 he became active with American Legion Post 90 in Cape Coral, Florida first as a member then as the Marketing Chair. Ted became the Public Relations (PR) Officer, Oratorical Chair, Executive Committee Board member, the Chair of the Legion Post's Buddy Check Program, a member of both the Honor Guard and Color Guard, the Ad Hoc Constitutional Committee and Associate Editor of the Post Newspaper, all at the same time! As the PR Officer, he manages a 5-member Marketing Committee to manage different media. Recently, his Marketing Committee assumed the additional responsibility of developing publicity for all the units within the Post, Legion, SAL, ALA, and Riders. Although Ted has only been with the Post for a couple of years, his contribution has had a tremendous impact in gaining positive publicity for Post 90 and resulted in a substantial membership increase across all four units. This is the reason he is receiving this edition of the Post Newspaper's "Tip of the Hat".

On Saturday, September 11th, 2021, American Legion Post 90 celebrated the 20th Anniversary of 9/11. This was the 20th Anniversary of the War on Terror, and we all remember where we were that fateful September morning in 2001. America lost over 2,000 of its citizens in New York, Washington D.C., and in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. You may know someone who lost their life that day. Let us never forget! The Flag Retirement Ceremony at American Legion Post 90 started at 3pm and a 21-gun salute was performed by the American Legion Post 90 Honor Guard. At 4pm, everyone went into the Legion for a free Spaghetti Dinner and cake.


