Due to the shrinking of the number of people on the Executive Committee, I am requesting that the following amendment be read at the next general membership meeting on June 27, 2022, to allow for a vote at the following general meeting in July. This is required to allow a vote in the July meeting. Both need to be completed per our current bylaws.

Post 90 By-Laws Amendment

Discussion – The current requirement of 10 members of the Executive Committee was written based on having an individual member as Commander, 1st Vice, 2nd Vice, Finance Officer, Chaplain, Historian, Sergeant-of-Arms, Adjutant, Judge Advocate, Service Officer, and 7 E-Board members for a total of 17 individual members. For this next year we only have 11 individual members on the Executive Committee allowing for only one member to be missing for the Executive Committee meeting to have a quorum. The proposed amendment would change the requirements for an Executive Meeting quorum to be a minimum of 60% of the Executive Committee personnel to be in attendance. Based on the incoming Executive Committee, this would require a minimum of 7 members to be present for a quorum.

Article VII – Executive Committee

Section 2 Quorum

Ten (10) members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Amended to:

60% of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

<u>American Legion Post 90 of Cape Coral wins multiple awards</u> <u>at Florida American Legion Department Convention</u>

The American Legion Department hosted its 103rd state-wide convention June 16th-June 19th, 2022, at the Hilton Orlando Lake Buena Vista, Florida.

American Legion Post 90 in Cape Coral won five awards and an honorable mention: the winner of the Best Post Sergeant-at-Arms, the Best Blood Drive Program, the Best Public Relations Program, Best Shooting Team Program, and an Honorable Mention for its retention percentage of members. In addition, Post 90's History Narrative Book scored #5 of 21 entries, but not high enough for an award. This History Narrative Book is now at American Legion Post 90 in the office, and anyone can view it at any time that Post 90 is open. However, the most prestigious honor was awarded to Ted Clark as Legionnaire of the Year. Ted is the Public Relations officer for Post 90 and was both surprised and delighted at receiving the award. Ted stated "It is not the individual, but the team that provides the ideas and implements them. For example, my Marketing Committee has been spectacular in developing and implementing marketing concepts, which is one of the reasons I was awarded this honor." Ted is a member of the Executive Committee, a member of the Honor and Color Guard, the Chairman of the PR Committee, a member of the Ad Hoc Constitutional Committee, the Oratorical Scholarship Chair, Chair of the Buddy Check program, Chair of the Ad Hoc Credit Card Committee, Coeditor of the Post Newsletter, and one of the three Post Facebook Administrators.

Approximately 3,000 American Legion members, including spouses and family members, were in attendance at the American Legion Department Convention. Due to its size, there was something for everyone to be enjoyed at this significant event, from vendors, banquets, activities, classes, etc. It was an excellent time for posts to gather, exchange ideas, and reunite as a family. The American Legion Department of Florida has over 130,000 members, with more than 300 Legion Posts across the state. The Department convention also conducts its annual business during this event, electing new leadership, celebrating successes, and recognizing outstanding individuals and posts.

Post 90 honors Mariner high's JROTC shooting team

It started on Feb 17 with the first Marksmanship Match of the "King of the Cape" competition between the five high schools in Cape Coral – Mariner, Ida Baker, Island Coast, Cape Coral and Oasis. For the last eight years, Oasis has been the King of the Cape winners, but this year Mariner High School won all five matches held throughout February, March, and April. Post 90 has been an active supporter of all the Cape Coral high schools shooting programs.

The King of the Cape Trophy was presented to the Mariners team captain after the match on Apr 13. Mariner did not stop there. They went on to the South Florida District Competition and won first place on April 22 with Oasis taking second. The next day at the JROTC Florida State Marksmanship Competition at Island Coast, Mariner came in fourth place in the Team Competition for the entire state of Florida.

In the Individual Competition, Mariner had the top overall best shooter – first place went to Nathan Krokstrom, the best of 92 shooters. Mariner also had team members win 10th, 21st and 56th statewide. As a result, Mariner is headed to the national championship in Ohio.

Dennis Stebbins, the American Le-

gion Post 90 Marksman Chairman and Co-Chairman Carl Saitta were immensely proud of the JROTC Cadets and their accomplishments.

"Given the level of competition at the District and State, Cape Coral high schools did extraordinarily well over the past several years, but this year is exceptional," said Stebbins.

American Legion Post 90 presented awards to all five Cape Coral high schools that participated in the JROTC Program and Saitta awarded a check for \$500 to Mariner to help fund their trip to the nationals in Ohio.

American Legion Post 90 was founded in April 2001, and membership is open to all veterans. The Post offers a full canteen and lunch and dinner at its location on Southeast 47th Street in Cape Coral, and sponsors scholarships, Boy Scout, and Girl Scout troops, blood drives, V.A. volunteer and national emergency funds programs to assist veterans in need. 




American Legion Post 90 Memorial Day Celebration
