Hello everyone,

We are still in need of additional help if you would like to join in. Hello everyone,

We are still dealing with the results from Hurricane Ian. Although Post 90 is back in full operating mode, it still has a lot of damage that has to be fixed. We have contracted for the repairs to the façade fronting on 47th Street and were repaired in February. The roof is under contract and work on it began the week of February 13, 2023. We will be contracting with the canvas company to construct and install the 2 small canopies located on the west side of the building. Still under debate is to replace the old front canopy that was on the south side of the building or construct a Tiki style roof over the entire patio similar to the roof over the outside dining area at the Cape Cabaret. To construct the Tiki style roof would entail raising additional funds. If you have any thoughts regarding this plan, please contact the Commander, Keith Berres or me.

At present, our insurance company will cover about \$111,000 in replacement costs minus the deductible of \$20,850. We are still accepting donations for the repair of Hurricane Ian damages and the “Post 90 Improvement Project” to replace some of the aging appliances and furniture. Please contact the Commander, Second-Vice Commander, or Bar Manager regarding your donation for Post repairs and replacements. Now that the NFL football season is over, the Post 90 kitchen will be closed on Sundays. We are still planning special events for March and April. So, keep your calendars open as events could happen in a moment’s notice.

In the last week of February and through all of March, Post 90 will be managing 2 concession stands at JetBlue Park during the Boston Red Sox spring training camp. Typically, there are 18 games both in the afternoon and evenings. The funds that are raised this year will go to repairing the Hurricane Ian damages and some will go to our approved charities. We have more than 70 members and friends who have volunteered to work the games, but there are still some open positions. Please sign-up. We carpool from the Post on the game days, as there is limited parking for us workers. The sign-up sheets are located on the bulletin board by the Kitchen. There have been many changes to the Post’s Entry and Alcohol Purchasing policies. Remember, be proud to show your membership card at this Post and any other Post you should visit. Post 90’s Service Officer is Lakesha “Kesha” Penn. If you are in need of assistance, please do not hesitate to call her.

Beginning on March 1, 2023, the sign-up sheet for Post 90 Officers and Executive Board Committee positions will be posted on the bulletin board by the west entry door. These are important positions necessary to keep Post 90 running smoothly and profitably. Your knowledge and expertise is needed to accomplish Post 90 goals. Please consider volunteering for a position for the year commencing July 2023 and ending June 2024.

POST 90 MARKETING CORNER



Hello everyone,

I am delighted to report the successful outcome the Marketing Committee, in coordination with the Auxiliary and the Riders, experienced at Cape Coral's 2023 Arts Festival. The festival is the most significant cultural event the City of Cape Coral offers, coordinated by the Cape Coral Rotary Club, held on Saturday and Sunday, 1/14 and 1/15. We spoke to approximately 415 festival attendees (a 122% increase over last year) and distributed 44 applications (a 25% increase) and 70 business cards (a 55% increase). Most importantly, we collected contact information on 43 prospects (a 38% increase), including 3 SAL, 5 ALA, 32 Legion prospects, and 3 transfers. Of course, now the difficult work of "following up" on these prospective leads begins; however, the publicity obtained for our Post and our programs, gained from being exposed to thousands of festival attendees and passers-by, is challenging to measure but effective in enhancing our image and promoting our Post. Although, the number of festival attendees at the Art Festival easily exceeded the Oktoberfest attendees, we were concerned the number of qualified prospects would be less significant or approximately the same in number as the Arts Festival. We expected this for three reasons:

- 1) We staffed the booth for two days at the Art Festival, whereas the Oktoberfest required more hours, 12-10 pm, for two days versus 10-4 for two days at the Arts Festival.
- 2) The wide geographic distribution of the attendees at the Art Festival was a challenge. The Art Festival is very popular with attendees from all over Lee County, making fewer attendees eligible for our Legion Cape Coral membership; however, it often required the same amount of time interviewing prospects.
- 3) At the point in time when attendees passing the booth at the Arts Festival were most numerous, we needed more staff to interview all the potential candidates. The SAL could not participate, and two Marketing Committee members were unavailable at the last moment. Next year we will recruit a more significant number of volunteers and work in shifts.

I want to thank all the members for setting up and staffing the tent. On Saturday, Nita and ALA member Pam Clark, Rebecca from the Riders, Bill McKernan, and I had an extraordinarily successful day staffing the booth despite the cold and wind. On Sunday, Nita, Pam, Rebecca, Jeff Zambrana, Hector Gomez, and I staffed the booth. We discovered the most successful strategy was to have Rebecca out in the crowd sending potential prospects to Bill, Hector, Jeff, and me at the table. Nita was on the other side of the road promoting poppy donations. The women were tremendous sales representatives. As I understand, the Auxiliary collected approximately \$2000 in poppy contributions.

We also sold 30 raffle tickets for the hand-made fishing pole that Ralph Camp created and contributed. I expect more success in the raffling off of fishing equipment at Bike Night because of the many fishermen and hunters that attend Bike Night.

I look forward to the Cape Coral Bike Night on Saturday, 12/11, from 5-10 pm. We are also reviewing the possibility of a booth at the Cape Coral Charity Car Show, scheduled at Mariner HS for February 25th, featuring a tribute to the military at noon. The CC Car Show is the largest classic car show in Lee county.

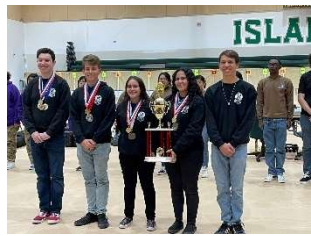

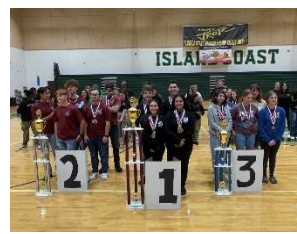

FOUR CHAPLAIN'S SERVICE



On Sunday, February 5th, 2023, at 1pm, a Four Chaplain's Ceremony was held at American Legion Post 90. This event celebrates the bravery and sacrifice of 4 Army Chaplains. On the evening of February 2nd, 1943, they gave their lives on the troop transport USAT Dorchester carrying 902 American servicemen, merchant seamen, and civilian workers to England (672 died and 230 survived). The Dorchester was 150 miles from its destination when it was struck by one of three torpedoes launched from the German submarine U-223. Aboard the Dorchester were 4 chaplains, Lt. George Fox (Methodist), Lt. Alexander Goode (Jewish), Lt. John Washington (Roman Catholic), and Lt. Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed). The surviving men saw the four chaplains with linked arms offering prayers as the ship sank. The chaplains had distributed life jackets to all except themselves.

Consequently, the four chaplains became an enduring example of extraordinary faith, courage, and selflessness. These men are honored annually at the Post for their service to their country. The ceremony is open to the public. The service consists of a Chaplain's prayer, a summary about the events that occurred on February 2nd, 1943, a short biography about each of the 4 chaplains, followed by a 21-gun salute & "Taps" by the Post 90 Honor Guard. Pictures of the event and all four chaplains are displayed on the Post's Facebook Page and Website. This year the readers for the service were American Legion Post 90 Commander, Keith Berres, John Baker, Ted Clark, Rebecca Sewell, Joe Noviello, and Chaplain Jerry Gray. Thank you to everyone who helped out.
