We have finished repairs to the Post facility resulting from damage caused by Hurricane Ian. The front canopy has been replaced with a Tiki Hut covering the entire patio. To complete this change, Post 90 is installing lighting, fans, speakers, and TVs and has purchased new furniture. The Tiki Hut should be fully completed by June.

We will be having special dinners at least once a month through the summer, and when possible, entertainment will be provided. Karaoke is held every Saturday, and as usual, entertainment is held every Friday night. Hello everyone,

Thanks to all members who renewed their membership for 2024 and the many transferring and new members to Post 90. We have exceeded the membership goal established by the American Legion. In fact, we are currently at 107% of the goal. With your help with recruiting new members, it is a reasonable assumption that 110% can be achieved by the end of May.

The American Legion has been testing a change in membership policy. This membership policy change will allow paid up 2024 American Legion Post 90 members to pay membership dues for three years (2025, 2026 and 2027) at the current 2024 Post 90 price of \$45.00. This is a savings to the member as Post 90's annual membership dues for 2025 will increase to \$55.00 on July 1, 2024. The three-year renewal can only be done online through The American Legion website at MyLegion.org, and you must create an account. I have seen many of the Post 90 members take advantage of this new program.

The easiest way to renew your membership is to sign-up on "MyLegion.org". As soon as you sign up through MyLegion.org and renew your membership, I can send your membership and door access cards to you. MyLegion has several functions that you may be interested in, and we are considering placing Post 90's newsletter on MyLegion rather than emailing it to you. When you access the web site, just follow the directions for signing up, and please enter your phone number and email address. Should we need to contact you, the phone and email work best.

To get a DD-214, here is a link: https://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records. We are halfway through Post's 2023-2024 fiscal year, and the Post has recruited prospective Officers and new members to the Executive Committee. A list of the potential officers is on the bulletin board. The election of officers will be on Monday, May 13th; 2024 from 3:00 to 7:00 PM. The Officer installation will be held after the next American Legion Convention which is June 13-16, 2024.

Remember, the Post holds its Membership Meetings every fourth Monday of the month beginning at 7:00 PM. Typically, they last 55 minutes to an hour, and much information is processed, gained, and approved during the meetings. Post 90 belongs to you, the Members, so, please come to the meetings and express your rights.

Unfortunately, we lost two valuable committee members due to relocation, which limited the number of events we could be involved in, such as Bike Night. However, we have generated a substantial amount of PR by submitting a record number of newspaper articles on various topics, from the Rider breakfast to the Oratorical Scholarship competition. The latter gave Post 90 exposure at the highest level in the state because it was the first time the Post had sent a scholarship candidate to compete at the Department level after winning the Post, District, and Area competitions. In addition, our Post was asked to join the Department Revitalization team partially because of the results we achieved in increasing membership well beyond our Post goals. Cape Coral student wins at American Legion

State Scholarship Competition

The Cape Coral American Legion Post 90 candidate, Kris Wydysh, won 3rd place at the Legion's State Oratorical Scholarship competition held at the Legion Department headquarters in Orlando, Florida on Saturday 3/30, after winning the competition at the Post, District and Area levels. Kris Isa, Junior at North Ft Myers High School, and has been active in the Florida YMCA Youth in Government Program, the Cape Coral Youth Council, an intern for a Cape Coral Councilmember, High School Student Government Assoc., and Lee County School District Student Advisory Committee.

To compete, Kris prepared and delivered an original 8 to 10-minute speech about the 2nd Amendment. He emphasized a citizen's duty to their country and their responsibility to adhere to that amendment. Additionally, Kris gave a 3–5minute speech on an assigned topic to test his

knowledge of one of four other Constitutional amendments.

At the local Post level, held in December 2024, the Post Commander, Keith Berres, awarded Kris, the first-place winner, a \$600 scholarship check. The district and area scholarships are \$300 each and at the state level, the awards are \$500-\$2500 for the top 6 contestants. Kris was awarded a \$1000 scholarship.

Ted Clark, the Post 90 Oratorical Chair, stated "he was thrilled and proud to see Kris excel at each level of the scholarship competition and hopes other Cape Coral students will be attracted to the Legion competition." Post Commander Berres said, "he is proud of the work done by members of the Post to help develop the potential of Cape Coral's high school students."

The American Legion Riders of Post 90 have been very active this past year. We are known as a 70mph billboard for the Legion. We had successful dinners in March and April. On May 4th, we will be doing our signature Italian Night Dinner. Breakfasts were put on hold for March and April, but we are back again on May 19th, from 8 to 11 am.

On March 23rd, we successfully completed our 1st Annual District 13 Winter Stamping Tour with a BBQ fundraiser at Punta Gorda Post 103. We had 63 stops throughout SWFL and participants had 4 months to complete the booklet. We raised over \$17,000 to distribute to the American Legion Posts destroyed by Hurricane Ian; Sanibel Post 123, Bonita Springs Post 303, Fort Myers Beach Post 274, and Port Charlotte Post 110 will all benefit. On April 21st, a foursome of Riders will embark on the Unity Tour to raise money for Project Vet Relief to end Veteran Suicide. ALR Chapter 90 will be donating a check for \$6,000 to Project Vet Relief when we arrive at St. James City Post 136 during this ride.


