

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POST 90 MARKETING CORNER



Hello Everyone,

With the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic that is affecting us all, the Buddy Check program is perhaps more important now than ever before. The idea behind the Buddy Check is to connect with veterans who may need assistance but do not know where to obtain information or simply may need help obtaining prescriptions or food. In March, the Post Adjutant requested the Post Marketing Committee conduct a Buddy Check program due to the pandemic. Unfortunately, at the time, only Amy, Bill, and I were available to make phone calls due to health issues in Elbert's family and Jeff's wife being seriously ill.

The roster contained 1079 veteran names, both active and expired members (their membership, not their lives). The phone number listed was called first, and if disconnected, we Googled their name for a current number or new number for that address. If no number was found and they had an e-mail address, we sent an e-mail. If they had neither a phone nor e-mail, we mailed a snail mail letter. If they had only an e-mail address, we used that. If the membership had expired, we also attached an application to the e-mail. Consequently, two vets requested renewal applications during the calls, and we mailed them apps.

Very few veterans stated they had any needs except for a few membership issues that we forwarded to Wayne Cave, Membership Chair. However, many expressed their gratitude for the call, especially some of the older veterans.

We called or e-mailed 66% of the roster to date - for a total of 712 records (.66 x 1079 = 712) and talked to the vet or a family member 15% of the time for a total of 106 conversations. If we left a voice mail message, we followed it up with an e-mail. The number of participants might have been higher if we had called from the Post because the Legion's ID would have appeared on the recipient's phone. Using our phones may have resulted in vets not picking up the phone because they did not recognize the number or name.



POST 90 MARKETING CORNER



The Marketing Committee discussed whether there was a need to continue making calls and sending e-mails if resources are available to veterans because the Museum is open and the Post partially open. It was suggested that a Buddy Check need not be completed only during an emergency; therefore, we decided to finish reaching out to current and expired members. To reduce the need to send e-mails to members who had only e-mail addresses and no phones, John Baker sent an e-mail blast with the Buddy Check script to everyone on the roster with an e-mail address.

We devoted between 80-90 hours to calling and e-mailing and determined that the weekends were the best time to call. Amy was the most productive and completed 50% of the list and had 50% of the conversations. We suspect her success was partially driven by her gender because participants are more receptive when they hear a female voice. Amy also devoted an extraordinary amount of time to the project.

We will submit the Buddy Check Report forms to the Post Adjutant when we complete the project.




Who Are Veterans?

As the Post's PR Officer, I found this article interesting in terms of marketing but more importantly understanding the fundamentals of who veterans are, how the demographic is changing and which retail and commerce sectors they are most responsive to.

- The majority of veterans served after 1990 in the Gulf War Era. This is approximately <u>7</u> <u>million</u> veterans.
- Veterans are a changing demographic. Most veterans are men, but <u>according</u> to findings by Pew Research, the number of female veterans is "projected to increase, from around 1.9 million in 2016 to 2.2 million in 2045."
- By 2040, the Department of Veteran's Affairs (VA) <u>projects</u> minorities will make up 35.7 percent of all living veterans, up from approximately <u>24%</u> currently.
- A Nielsen <u>report</u> *Beyond The Uniform: A Look At Today's Veteran Consumers* found veterans are more likely to respond to TV and print than the average population, but they match non-veteran consumers in use of social and mobile apps.

SPEND 13% MORE (\$4,478) THAN THE AVERAGE U.S. HOUSEHOLD AND TAKE 7% MORE SHOPPING TRIPS (128 ANNUALLY).

- 6% of money <u>spent</u> by veterans goes to military stores, where veterans receive promotions and discounts. Opportunities for non-military grocery stores marketing to veterans could lie in <u>targeting</u> veteran consumers whose shopping habits are impacted by household factors, like children.
- Veterans spend more at stores and take more shopping trips than the average American shopper. Categories where veterans out-shop non-veterans <u>include</u>: vitamins, office and school supplies, coffee and oral hygiene.
