“President Donald Trump signed legislation Saturday that will broaden options for troubled veterans in the legal system and expand a home renovations grant program for disabled and blind veterans.”

“The new Veteran Treatment Court Coordination Act directs the Justice Department to support the development and establishment of [veterans treatment courts](#) at the state, local and tribal levels.” As a Service Officer, I have had many interactions with this type of program here in Lee County. The program helps troubled veterans that are accused of crimes, normally minor offenses, as a deferment program. Post 90 has been helping the local veterans court for several years now.

According to the article, “The legislation also broadened the VA's caregiver program to include disabled veterans who served before Sept. 11, 2001 -- an expansion that will begin in October...” This is something new and it will take some time for it to fully be in effect as are most new programs.

Buddy Check Final Report 2020

Hello Everyone,

With the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic that affected us all, the Buddy Check program was perhaps more important now than ever before. The idea behind the Buddy Check was to connect with veterans who may need assistance but do not know where to obtain information or simply may need help obtaining prescriptions or food. On March 19, 2020, the Post Marketing Committee began a Buddy Check program due to the pandemic. The roster contained 1079 veteran names, both active and expired members.

Very few veterans stated they had any needs except for a few membership issues that we forwarded to Wayne Cave, Membership Chair. However, many expressed their gratitude for the call, especially some of the older veterans for checking on them. Three vets requested renewal applications during the calls, and we mailed them apps. Two rejoined.

As of 7/31/2020 we called or e-mailed .79% of the roster - for a total of 852 records and talked to the vet or a family member 15% of the time for a total of 125 conversations. If we left a voice mail message, we followed it up with an e-mail. We stopped calling at the end of July due to the end of the American Legion year and the ability of John Baker to e-mail the membership roster. For the Buddy Check next year, we plan to recruit the entire E-Board to be part of a Call Center at the Post because there were only 3 members of the marketing committee available, Amy O'Neill, Bill McKernan, and me.

POST 90 MARKETING CORNER



To give our Legion members an opportunity to learn what the PR Committee does, we have attached a copy of the minutes from our most recent meeting.

American Legion Post 90 Minutes from PR Committee meeting August 8th, 2020, 1200 hours

Our meeting's objective was to determine goals (what and how) for the PR Committee because of the challenging times imposed by COVID-19 and, consequently, the limitations on our marketing budget. Our goals are still to increase membership, stimulate activities among members, and develop a positive image among members and the public. Generally, the Committee accomplishes this in three ways: 1) promoting membership benefits at festivals, 2) placing ads in newspapers, radio, TV, and "Away from Home" media (DMV) and 3) public service announcements (PSAs). To continue to meet our goals with our budget limitations, we plan to emphasize recruiting members (the "what") using PSA announcements, and low-cost social media for the "how."

Newspapers

Bill will identify the public service officers or program directors, or community affairs officer for the Breeze and News-Press and develop relationships with them. The purpose is to issue press releases and Public Service Announcements (PSAs) about specific Post events and pitch to the press to cover items like community service and fundraising events. Bill plans to increase press releases and PSAs for the events held by the Post, for example - installation ceremonies. Amy will provide pictures that Bill can attach to the release. Also, Bill will determine the frequency and space available for the Post to request PSAs.

Web Page

Amy and Ted will work with Don Teasley, until he leaves and then Sean Wing. Several changes need to be made to the web page, including having a current member application, correct fee, and providing an address to return the app to our Post unless there is a requirement that the app must be first sent to HQ. The Webpage also needs to add Legion programs such as the Oratorical Scholarship Contest, placing photos in the photo gallery, inserting contact information for the Post officers, and a current list of Officers and E Board members. Applications for SAL and the Auxiliary should also be included.

Facebook

Facebook users ages 65+ are the fastest-growing demographic on the platform and account for 40% of users. Therefore, we discussed using our dedicated Facebook Post page more often to communicate with our members, offering more information to potential members and, most importantly, to create Facebook Events and advertise those events to a targeted audience.



We discussed having an email blast sent to all members, encouraging them to use Facebook, and will meet with John Baker to discuss further.

Many veterans turn to Facebook when they are looking for something to do. Because it allows the ability to search by category, date, time, location, it is not only a resource to keep our members informed but also inform prospective members. As an example, [the Facebook page for Sons of the American Legion – District 13](#) has upcoming events posted.

Newsletter

We agreed that E-Blasting the Newsletter was an effective way to increase distribution, given much of the information in the Newsletter is timeless and useful for event reminders. In addition to posting the Newsletter on our website, we discussed using an email software program like Constant Contact that makes it easy to design and deploy emails that look consistent and are user-friendly. The Military Museum uses Constant Contact for communication and keeps track of the number who opens the email and other useful stats. Ted will determine if there are a free trial period and the cost. Jeff and Amy will determine if the Museum can share its manual or digital visitor logs of veterans who visited and are member prospects.

Outside Events

We tossed around several ideas for outdoor events that could include a bike ride, a car parade, a horseshoe, or a corn hole competition, all generally considered safe to socialize. Local breweries are open, and we discussed if they would allow us to host a benefit night and offer discounts on their beer and the ability to bring our food until the Post can serve alcohol. If vets are looking for some comradery, these may be attractive events. Ted will follow up the feasibility with a couple of breweries.

Jeff led a discussion on tabling and tenting. He advised there are events scheduled this year, such as Bike Night and the Farmer's Market, the 50th Anniversary of Cape Coral next year is cancelled however, the Art Festival on January 21, 2021, the Irish festival in March 2021 and the German fest in Oct 2021 are excellent sources for recruiting prospects. Jeff will contact the organizers to determine space and cost - if any.

Finally, we discussed distributing recruiting posters and brochures (with stands) to area businesses. Ted will download posters from the HQ web site and check with HQ for stands. The meeting ended at 1330.

Quilters Guild honors local group of veterans

The Cape Coral Quilters Guild on Monday honored several veterans for their service to country with a labor of love.

One person from each of the five military branches (two from the U.S. Army) were given quilts during an honor quilt blessing ceremony Monday at American Legion Post 90 in downtown Cape Coral.

Nancy Leatherman, president of the quilters club, said the event is typically held in March at the Presbyterian Church where the group meets, but the pandemic cancelled that.

“One of our members felt so strongly about it that she got the American Legion to host it,” Leatherman said.

Rebecca Sewell, Director of the American Legion Riders, and a member of the Legion board, asked if they could get some publicity by holding the event at the Legion.

“The Legion was so nice to allow me to have this event here. Last year, I received a quilt,” Sewell said. “We are a veteran-oriented organization. Every year I go to the VFW or the Legion to do this.”

Nicholas A. Napolitano Jr., post commander, said it was an honor to be asked to host the event.

“These women do a great job being involved in other organizations and quilting for veterans. It’s a pleasure to know there are that many women who will take the time and effort to quilt these.”

The Cape Coral Quilters Guild sews charity quilts for hospitals, firefighters and, for the past few years, has made patriotic quilts for veterans.

The six recipients were:

John Peter Baker, Army, 1967-1973; Amy O’Neill, Army, 1998-2003; Harlan Hummel, Marines, 1951-1957; James Cousins, Navy, 1955-1987; John Mulvey, Air Force, 1952-1992. And Joseph Germain, Coast Guard, 1960-1966.

All of them were honored to be recipients.

“I was totally surprised. I don’t know how they kept it a secret from me, since I’m so active here.,” Baker said. “It’s beautiful. I think they’re all beautiful and everyone who received one deserved it.”

“I love it. My wife told me a while ago and they called a couple weeks ago,” Mulvey said. “It’s really nice. It took a lot of hours for them to do this. I can use it when my wife throws me out of the house.”

“I felt honored. I had never gotten a quilt before, but I knew about the organization. I think they’re wonderful,” O’Neill said. “I feel like I’m blessed to have so much family around me. I love what I do, and this helps me.”

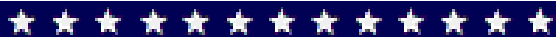
