I consider the January 2019 Blood Drive a success even though we did not reach our goal of 25 units. Our next blood drive is April 6, 2019.

We had 28 people participate and come out to give, and we collected 20 units of blood for Lee Health. Those who could not give blood this time may have been denied because of high blood pressure, low iron count, and others due to medications that were being taken. Try to avoid foods which have salt and nitrates in them as they tend to raise the blood pressure. Canned soups have a high level of salt, and try to avoid milk products near your donation time. Calcium in milk seems to pull your iron count down. Please remember this for our next blood drive on April 6.

The blood drives attract new donors every time when they see our posters. Our advertising for the blood drive starts about two weeks before the actual drive. Posters and the sign-up sheet are put up at Post 90. We also put posters at Fuller-Metz Funeral Home, the SW Florida Military Museum, Moose Club #2199, Cape Cabaret and many other places. We also advertise in the Cape Coral Breeze newspaper. Flyers and Posters will be available at our membership meeting on March 25, 2019. Please join us at 7:00 PM and be a supporter of this Post 90 project. Take a few posters and put them up and pass them around.

At our last Blood Drive on January 12, we had a blood donor recruiter form Lee Health with us, Mr. Jeremy Puckett. He spoke to us about the weekly need of 800 units at the four hospitals in Lee County. Population growth in Lee County has required that more beds be added to Gulf Coast Medical Center. More blood is needed. **IT IS A LIFE SAVER**. Mr. Puckett also stated the Post 90 donates more blood than any other American Legion Post in Lee County.

Please come out on Saturday, April 6, 2019 from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM for our last blood drive before the long hot summer.

Please sign-up, don't forget, and plan for it now.


